IN OTHER VILLAGE HAPPENINGS

From the meeting minutes:

December - Dave Atchley, Village Engineer updated the Board on the progress and costs of the drainage project. The area was found to have soupy areas with higher water table than expected. The issue was corrected. Village Attorney, Marc Miller presented a Liquor Ordinance amendment that allowed for an extra hour of operation for Village businesses selling alcohol due to the holiday falling on a Sunday and the Philo Tavern Customer Appreciation Day. Mr. Miller also explained that the Village will be required to pass a Sexual Harassment Ordinance required by the State of Illinois and based off our insurance company model. The January meeting will be conducted as a "Special Meeting" and an ordinance will be passed to establish the regular meetings for calendar year 2018. Dave Traxler, Village Maintenance presented a quote for a new scoreboard and control for the R. E. Franks Center/Thelma Melohn Gym.

January - Dave Atchley, Village Engineer updated the Board on the final progress of the drainage project. Marc Miller, Village Attorney was on vacation. The Sexual Harassment Policy Ordinance was passed as well as the Meeting Dates for 2018 calendar year. Dave Traxler was asked to look into different pricing for Wi-Fi and advertising for the new scoreboard for the R. E. Franks Meeting Center/Thelma Melohn Gym. Renewal of the lease for Hugs & Bugs Preschool was tabled until the February meeting.

Countryside United Methodist Church serves the rural areas south east of Champaign-Urbana. The church building is actually listed as an emergency shelter with the ESDA of Champaign County and it is extensively used as a meeting place for many area organizations.

Saturday, March 24 CUMC, located at 1807 County Road 1000 North (between Sidney/Philo) will hold their 14th annual fund raiser flea market and bake sale. The doors will open at 7:00am and close at 2:00pm. The flea market will have many items for the entire household. A silent auction takes place throughout the day for "specialty items and treasures".

Folks can go shopping in the Clothes Closet, Children's Store, Book Nook or stop by the Bakery & Sweets Shoppe for some delicious homemade pies, cakes, cookies, or fudge all packaged and ready to take home. The SonShine Café will serve breakfast and lunch. Breakfast will include biscuits & gravy, rolls, pastries, fruit, coffee and juice. The lunch menu will consist of BBQ pork chop sandwiches, hot dogs, chili dogs, chips, fruit, drinks and desserts.

This year's proceeds will be divided into three portions. One portion will go to UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) to aid victims of weather, fire and natural disasters within the USA. A second portion will go to the Love Packages Program. This Illinois based, "in home" program started in 1975. Unwanted Christian literature is collected, boxed and sent in ocean going containers to port cities around the world and distributed in "Love Packages" to thousands of English speaking churches. The third portion will go to Countryside & the Tolono United Methodist Churches for their Mission Trip to the Henderson Settlement in Kentucky.

Donated items can be brought to the church any time after March 1st. A designated area in the education wing will be open for drop offs.
