We had a great report from our annual audit. The Village is fiscally sound and in compliance with all regulations. I am happy to report that the R. E. Franks Meeting Center has been paid off. We hope to start with some updates to the facility in the future.

Thank you to the Philo Kids Festival committee and all who attended the event. The committee is working to raise money for new playground equipment.

I also want to thank everyone who has registered their golf carts and following the regulations. This seems to be very popular in the evening, so if you are driving through town, keep an eye out for slow moving vehicles, walkers, runners, bikes and farm equipment as we roll into harvest.

#### IN OTHER VILLAGE HAPPENINGS

From the meeting minutes:

June - The Village was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation by the Sons of American Legion for allowing them to collect the metals for recycling at our Spring Community Clean-up day. The raise money for a child welfare fund. The Philo Kids Festival presented information and updated the Trustees. The 2018-2019 MFT program in the amount of \$54,301.03 was passed. Bid for work at Hale Park was accepted. Philo Gas & Car Wash (a.k.a. Corner Store) surrendered their liquor license in preparation of business transfer to new owners.

**July** - Restriping of Washington & North Harrison Streets is scheduled. 2018-2019 Appropriations Ordinance was presented and approved unanimously. The brush burn pile needs cleaned out and hauled away at a cost of

approximately \$250 per load and will take 10 - 12 loads. Sourceline Media lease was renewed. The Swimming Pool Ordinance was reviewed. No changes were made. Executive session was held to discuss employment, performance and wages.

August - Minutes will be approved at the September board meeting to be held Wednesday, September 12, 2018 in the Eileen Painter Room of the R. E. Franks Meeting Center. Meeting minutes are posted on the Village web site www.villageofphilo.com under the Village Board tab after they are approved at the following monthly meeting. The public is invited to attend.

#### **Planning Commission**

Over the last couple of years the Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals has been combined, at the request of the Village President and the Board of Trustees, in an effort to simplify the planning, building and ordinance process. The appointed members are now considered the Planning Commission. The Village Engineer along with his staff and the newly reorganized Commission members meet regularly on the second Wednesday of the month at 5:30pm. They have worked tirelessly over the last eighteen months on updating the Village of Philo Zoning Ordinance and the Village of Philo Subdivision Ordinance. Both of these documents are now ready to be reviewed by the Village President and Board of Trustees for adoption. There will be a public open house during the Planning Commission meeting on Wednesday, September 12 at 5:30pm for any interested parties. Both documents can be reviewed in advance at the Village office between the hours of 8:00am -11:00am; Monday - Friday.



#### **Marvin Lee - Summer Concert Series**

Marvin Lee will continue bringing his country music concert series to Hale Park the first two Tuesday's in September from 6:30pm - 8:30pm. This is a free event open to the public. Bring your lawn chairs and enjoy the late summer evenings in Philo. The Philo Volunteer Firemen will have pork chops on hand for a fee.

#### Philo Country Music Show at the R. E. Franks Center

On Sunday, November 4, 2018 and Sunday, December 2, 2018 at 3:00 pm, the Philo Country Music show will be hosted by Ed Clem and Chrissy Sparks, featuring Dyke Corson, lead, steel guitar, and vocals; Dave Ohlsson, drums and vocals with Ed, bass, vocals & Chrissy on piano, sax and vocals. Special guest in November will be Dennis Stroughmatt on fiddle and vocals. Their Branson-style live music stage show is held at the RE Franks Meeting Center, 108 W. Madison Street in Philo. Tickets are \$10 per person at the door. Concessions are available.

### **BRUSH PICK-UP**

The 2018 seasonal brush pick-up will continue through December 1 weather permitting. Pick-ups are done on the  $1^{st}$  and  $15^{th}$  of each month. If those dates fall on a weekend or holiday, the pick-up will be the following Monday or next day.

Use paper bags for plant material 12 inches or smaller.

Stack limbs that are 12 to 60 inches in length.

Cut items that are longer than 60 inches.

Cut wood limbs that are greater than 6 inches in diameter into 3 foot or less length pieces and separate.

#### **Burnings Leaves & Yard Waste**

As the trees turn colors and begin to lose their leaves many people will choose to burn their leaves instead of bag them. Please be conscious of how it impacts your neighbors. Many people have allergies or sensitivities to smoke. Residents may burn leaves, sticks and other plants grown or generated in the Village of Philo in a safe manner during daylight hours. Do not burn wet leaves.

#### **Golf Cart Registration**



Due to ongoing complaints to Village Trustees, they want to remind residents that the use of ATV's, motorbikes, golf carts without permits and other off-road vehicles are not allowed on village

streets, parks, ball diamonds and other properties of the village. Only inspected golf carts are allowed on the village streets when being operated by a licensed driver. Per a 2009 ordinance, individuals who intend to drive their golf carts on Village streets must obtain a permit from the Village and have their carts inspected, among other criteria.

- \*\*Qualifying golf carts must have a maximum attainable speed of 20 miles per hour and be properly equipped.
- \*\*Any person who operates a golf cart must be at least 18 years of age and possess a valid driver's license and insurance coverage. The maximum occupancy in the cart is one person per bucket seat or two people per bench seat.
- \*\*Golf carts are to be driven on streets only and from sunrise to sunset.
- \*\*The annual permit fee is \$15 for citizens ages 65 years and older and \$30 for all others.
- \*\*Golf cart inspection appointments may be made with Trustee Paul Brady at <a href="mailto:paul-brady@comcast.net">paul-brady@comcast.net</a> or by phone at 684-2540.

#### ATV's and other off-road vehicles are NOT allowed on village streets or properties.

Violations are punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$500 for each violation.

The ordinance and complete list of requirements is available at the Philo Village Office inside the R. E. Franks Meeting Center at 127 West Washington Street. Office hours are Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. You may call 684-2562 or e-mail inquiries to janet@villageofphilo.com.

#### **Transient/Solicitation/Peddlers Permits**

The Village has an ordinance for door-to-door sales. Persons wishing to go door-to-door for solicitation are required to obtain a permit from the village office. This does not apply to schools, Scouts and other local fundraising groups. Solicitation hours are 8:00am to 8:00pm and the permit is \$10 per person per day. Solicitors are issued a permit that they must carry with them while in the village and show upon request.

Any other Hazardous Materials


Grass clippings, brush or other yard debris
