ORDINANCE NO. 306

ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO PEDDLERS,  
SALESMEN, AND SOLICITORS

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Philo as follows:

Section 1: License Required. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to engage in the business of hawking or of peddling any merchandise, article or thing anywhere in the village or to solicit donations or to solicit information for polls or questionnaires without having first obtained a license therefor. No license shall be required for any person or persons selling vegetables, fruit, milk, eggs, or other produce of their own farm or premises; nor to the peddling of milk or other dairy products; nor to the peddling of newspapers; nor to the taking of orders and the delivery of goods to their customers by established dealers in the regular course of business; nor for high school or elementary school children engaging in school sponsored projects involving such activities; nor to organizations soliciting from and to members of that organization only.

Section 2: Applications. Applications for such licenses shall be made to the village clerk, and shall state thereon the number of vehicles, if any, intended to be operated; the kind of article or merchandise to be peddled, or the type of donation or information solicited, and the permanent address of the peddler, salesman, or solicitor.

Section 3: Fees. The fees for peddlers', salesmen's, and solicitors' licenses shall be Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per day.

Section 4: To Carry License. Each peddler, salesman or solicitor receiving a license from the village shall be required to carry such license upon his person while engaged in such business within the village, and shall exhibit such license to any person upon request.

Section 5: Fraud. Any licensed peddler, hawker, salesman or solicitor who shall be guilty of any fraud, cheating or misrepresentation, whether himself or through an employee, while acting as a peddler or solicitor in the village or who shall barter, sell or peddle any goods, wares or merchandise other than those specified in the application for a license, or who shall solicit other than as specified in his application, shall be fined as provided hereinafter.

The Village President may revoke his license for such offense.

Section 6: Restricted Hours. No one having a peddlers' or salesmen's license shall offer for sale in the village any of his merchandise, articles or items which he is selling before the hour

of 8:00 A.M. or after 8:00 P.M., Monday through Saturday and shall not offer any merchandise, articles or items at any time on Sunday; likewise no one having a solicitors' license shall conduct solicitations other than during those hours aforesaid.


Section 7: Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this article shall be fined not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

Section 8: Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective upon its passage and publication as provided by law and when so effective shall effect the repeal of Ordinance No. 143 adopted on August 6, 1969.
