### Be a Good Neighbor

The Village Board encourages everyone to be a good neighbor and to keep the village clean and safe. Many of the calls we receive are just common courtesy, but from time to time an ordinance is required for guidelines. Some of the most common ordinances have been added to our web site along with updated village zoning and subdivision ordinances. You should be able to search these documents and print off any permits or registrations needed. Please call the office if you have any questions or need further information.

Other ways to be a good neighbor:

- Be courteous when burning lawn debris. There
  are many people with breathing issues. Smoke
  from burning leaves is detrimental to their health.
  Do not burn wet piles of leaves, sticks and other
  plants.
- Always pickup after your animals, particularly when they defecate on any property that does not belong to you. This includes, but not limited to streets, public parks, and the Franks Center property.
- By law, dogs must be on a leash when not on the owner's property.
- Put trash receptacles away after garbage pickup.
- Keep your property neat and orderly. Mow regularly. Do not leave piles of debris for extended periods of time.
- Be conscientious of noise levels such as early morning mowing or after dark.
- If you have any questions about the regulations and ordinances in the Village you may call the office for clarification.



#### The Gold Star Mission:

They say that "a Hero dies twice ~ once when the last breath leaves their body, and again when their name is spoken for the last time". The Gold Star Mission strives to preserve the memories and ensure the names of our nearly 300 Fallen Illinois Service Men and Women live on!

The Gold Star Mission is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that Honors and Supports Gold Star Families by preserving the memory of our Fallen Heroes through service to others in need.

The Gold Star Mission conducts grueling endurance events to raise both awareness of the service and sacrifices of our Fallen Service Members, and also raise funds through generous donations and use the funds to carry on the names and the stories of these Fallen Heroes. The Gold Star Mission intends to help those in need, including the establishment of scholarship opportunities.

What better way is there to preserve and honor the names of our Fallen Service Members than through scholarships? These scholarships, named in honor of the Fallen Illinois Service Members, will assist Gold Star Family members and will help others of whom they likely never knew, thus preserving their name forever, and showing the same act of compassion to others which their service exemplified. In the first three years of existence, The Gold Star Mission has awarded 130 Scholarships in the names of these Fallen Heroes.

The Gold Star Mission's endurance events include: the Run for the Fallen Half Marathon, 5K, 3K Run/Walk in Rockford (1-15 May 2021); the General Logan 200 endurance bicycling event covering 200 miles in under 20 hours (10-11 July 2021); and the Gold Star 500 – a 523 mile, five day endurance bicycling event throughout Illinois (21-25 September 2021).

This is the second year the "Gold Star Mission Run for the Fallen" will take place in Rockford, IL. The inaugural event, achieved tremendous strides in bringing awareness and honoring our local Gold Star Families with an event that had over 425 participants. This event provides a platform to remember and preserve the memory of our Fallen Heroes - some of who are from our local communities. The money raised through fundraising efforts and the race entry fee will be used for scholarships, distributed annually, in the names of the Fallen Soldiers. This race will continue to be an annual, ongoing event for the community of Rockford, IL.

The Gold Star 500, an annual five day -500+ mile endurance bicycling event - which honors the service and sacrifice of nearly 300 servicemen and women from Illinois who gave their lives in Iraq and Afghanistan in honor of our great nation. The nearly 300 made the ultimate sacrifice while protecting and aiding people of foreign lands, people they likely never knew or even met. They died so others could have a better life; their names must live on.

On September 21, 2021, a team of primarily, Veteran and Service Member bicyclists (projected total of 40-50 riders) will begin a 520+ mile journey, with the intent of this ride, to carry the torch of personal sacrifice in honor of these service members, to carry on their stories, their courage, and to honor the legacy of their names.

These events are a way of honoring the service members by assisting Gold Star Families and others in need through scholarship opportunities. This ride will preserve the names of the fallen by honoring their service and sacrifice, for we must Never Forget.

Are there other ways you can support The Gold Star Mission? In addition to a financial donation, The Gold Star Mission could use volunteers! Both the Run for the Fallen and Gold Star 500 require many volunteers; from pre-event coordination and staging, event registration and sign-in assistance, scheduled rest stops, and/or end-of-event ceremony support. The Gold Star Mission engages all elements of the community; such as K-12 schools, Veteran Service Organizations, Businesses, Service Organizations, Faith Based Organizations, Community Leaders, and local citizens to assist in the safe and efficient execution of these events. Volunteers are tremendous local champions for The Gold Star Mission and more importantly our Fallen Heroes and their Gold Star Families!

Patrons may be required to show proof of residency.

Dumpsters will be available at the Premier Coop (elevator) lot located at the northeast corner of East Washington & Adams Streets.

Items that <u>cannot</u> be put in the dumpsters:

- Tires
- Batteries
- Paint
- Motor Oil
- Propane Tanks
- Acid or Alkaline Products
- Any other Hazardous Materials
- Grass clippings, brush or other yard debris

#### PHILO BRUSH PICKUP RULES

Brush pickup will start April 1st and continue through December 1st.

Brush will be picked up on the 1<sup>st</sup> and the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month, weather permitting. Brush & debris is to be on your property and not in the roadway.

*Note:* If the 1<sup>st</sup> or 15<sup>th</sup> falls on a Saturday or Sunday then pickup will be the following Monday.

Christmas Trees will be picked up on or around January 15

#### **ACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:**

- Tree and shrub materials 12 inches or smaller, leaves and grass clippings, etc. which need to be put in **paper bags**.
- Limbs 12 to 60 inches need to be put out front of property. (Not on road or alley ways)
- **Stack neatly please.**
- ❖ Anything longer than 60 inches needs to be cut.
- ❖ Bulk wood limbs greater than 6 inches in diameter must be cut into 3 foot or less length and separated from other yard waste.

#### **UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS:**

- ❖ NO PLASTIC BAGS (IEPA Regulation).
- No lumber or railroad ties, wood pallets, soil or sod, animal and/or food waste, concrete riprap or rocks, tree stumps or root wads, flocked Christmas trees.

## Recycling

Please help keep the recycling center and surrounding area clean and neat. Do not leave anything outside of the recycling containers if they are full as this creates a wet, soggy, unsightly mess and added expense to the Village. Please come back later. You can make extra space by breaking down your boxes.

## **Biennial Golf Cart Registration**



We have over 50 golf carts registered! The village Board thanks all of those users. In 2020 the Village Board updated the golf cart ordinance and regulations. A copy of the ordinance can be found on the website. Individuals who intend to drive their golf

carts on Village streets must obtain a permit from the Village and have their carts inspected.

Open alcohol and/or drinking and driving are illegal.
\*\*Only inspected golf carts are allowed on the Village
streets when being operated by a *licensed driver 16 years*or older. Any person who operates a golf cart must possess
a valid driver's license and insurance coverage.

- \*\*Qualifying golf carts must have a maximum attainable speed of 20 miles per hour and be properly equipped.
- \*\*The maximum occupancy in the cart is one person per bucket seat or two people per bench seat.
- \*\*Golf carts can be driven on streets after dark, only with proper qualifying equipment (headlights; taillights; signals; slow moving emblem).
- \*\*The biennial permit fee is \$50. A new sticker will be issued at renewal. The renewal date is May 1. Reminder letters will be sent to all registered users in the spring of 2022.

\*\*Golf cart inspection appointments may be made with Trustee Paul Brady at paul-brady@comcast.net, by phone at 684-2540 or by calling the village office at 684-2562.

ATV's and other off-road vehicles are NOT allowed on Village streets or properties, this includes the hill and drainage pond area.

Violations are punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$500 for each violation.
