#### IN OTHER VILLAGE HAPPENINGS

Summary of notes from the meeting minutes:

August – Request made by the co-chairs of the Planning Commission for a new member. Representative from VIDCom was present to answer questions regarding the video surveillance system. Road work to be completed on Washington & Harrison St. Improvements at Hale Park discussed. Radar speed signs discussed. ESDA needs updated equipment. Boardroom media equipment was installed.

**Special Meeting** – a Special Meeting was held on August 24 to approve sidewalk bids for Hazen Park.

September – NE Storm drainage project put on hold for the season. Bids will be requested again in January for spring work. Speeding and signage were discussed; President Franks to contact sheriff's office with suggestions from Trustees. Preliminary quotes distributed to Trustees for a new Village maintenance shed. Bids for asphalt reviewed. Request for updated bids to include more area and a special meeting to review said bids. Donor signs for Hazen Park discussed. Recycling bins continue to be a problem. Special Meeting — a Special Meeting was held on September 22 to review and approve bids for surfacing of parking areas at Hazen Park.

October – All road and drainage work on hold for the season. All sidewalk work and paving at Hazen Park complete. Tax Levy discussed. Radar speed limit signs presented and approved. Request for R E Franks Center rental rate increase.

**November** -- Minutes will be approved at the December board meeting to be held Wednesday, December 14, 2022 in the Eileen Painter Room of the R. E. Franks Meeting Center. The meeting will begin at 6:30pm.


# **Extra Recycling**

# **Chris's Service Company**

Chris's Service Company has been a family owned and operated Philo staple for 40 years. This garbage collection service covers the towns of Urbana, Philo, Tolono, Pesotum, Sadorus, Sidney, Homer, Allerton, Broadlands, Camargo, Newman, Murdock, Sidell and the surrounding areas. When Chris Johnson bought the Urbana-based company in 1982, he had only 500 customers. Now they serve 7,000 customers and call the northwest edge of Philo home.

Chris's son Josh now runs the daily operations of the business. He's worked there for 25 years, but really, he's been helping out since he was 5. Josh's daily morning tasks include inspecting the trucks, and doing safety checks. When the crew comes in, they pick up trash at the houses that have "toters" set out. Tuesday is their biggest day when they pick up 1,000-1,200 toters which takes about 6 hours. After that, they empty the trucks at the landfill in Danville.

Chris's employs 8 workers including Josh, a mechanic, and a secretary. They have 6-7 trucks and can be seen working on holidays, but they typically take the weekends off; although Josh can often be found working on trucks then or whatever else needs to be done. Like many businesses, their company is short staffed at the moment. Because of this, they aren't able to take on new customers currently. They have only 2 drivers, but typically have 4. They are in great need of hiring drivers that have a CDL. (If interested, contact them to apply.) They prefer to work in teams of 3. To help the team, there is a camera with audio on the back of the truck and a monitor in the cab to enhance communication during pick up.

Keeping the trucks working can be a challenge at times. Their trucks have a few years on them but newer trucks with new emissions standards have their own set of problems. Chris's trucks can hold about 14 tons when full! The trash is frequently compacted to make room

for more. It weighs about 2500 pounds per cubic yard. And you thought your trash was heavy!

The garbage needs to be collected no matter the temperature. Josh and Chris recall that in their 40 years, they weren't able to run their routes in only 2 or 3 instances, one being an ice storm, and another where they were snowed in. Josh said that some of his workers use Hothands packets in their pockets. Being highly visible is key so he wears lime green and orange reflective clothing often. He likes having a job where he can work outside and not sit behind a desk. When he's not working, he enjoys camping, boating, and golfing.

When asked what the most unusual thing that he's found in the garbage, he said he's seen all kinds of things, but one that really stands out is the lost wedding ring he found. A customer called and explained that they realized that the ring had accidently been put in the trash, and asked if he could look for it. Josh recalled that customer's trash being in a large box. Even though he had already taken it to the landfill, he searched for the box and found the lost wedding ring there.

When asked what they won't pick up, he said any extra items outside the toters such as couches. Also, Josh says they don't offer recycling pickup for plastics because it's complicated. There are several rules that must be followed and the supply chain is limited now that China doesn't accept it anymore.

What the future will hold for Chris's? Josh said that he hopes to still be throwing trash but joked that maybe when I'm 18, I could buy the business from him.

The only tip Josh had for customers is to always set out the trash cans the night before. They will take care of the rest. Please give them a call if you are seeking employment and if driving our beautiful countryside is of interest to you.

# Philo Phlashbacks

A little bit of Philo history from the archives.

#### July 1965

#### **Philo Votes to Install Water Meters**

The Philo Village Board has voted to install water meters within the next year. Estimated cost of the project will be approximately \$100 per each of the 260 users of the municipal water system. Financing will be handled by Benjamin Lewis Company in total amount of \$40,000 to \$45,000 water revenue bonds which will pay 4.5 per cent interest. Of this amount \$9,000 will be used to retire currently outstanding bonds. Installation of the water meters is necessitated by high volume water usage, and it is anticipated total use will decrease from 25 to 33 per cent when charges are changed from the current \$2.50 flat monthly fee to the metered charge basis.

#### October 1973

#### **Philo Main Street Project Completed**

Philo's Main Street improvement project has been completed about 6 weeks after it started. Village trustees estimated the cost for 350 feet of blacktop at about \$50,000. Included in the project were new curbs and gutters and a new storm drain. According to a Village Trustee, some Federal Revenue Sharing Funds will be used for the new drainage system, while most of the road work will be paid from the Motor Fuel Tax. Additional funding for the project will be from the General Fund. Only available tax funds were used, according to the Trustee. A new water main was also installed, under a separate contract awarded to Illini Plumbing and Champaign Asphalt was awarded the contract for the Main Street improvement. Yellow marking lines have been painted on the new street, including 43 parking spaces. The project was the first major Main Street renovation since the 1920s.



#### Santa Breakfast Is Back!


