FROM THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT Larry Franks

The Board of Trustees and I hope you had a safe and healthy holiday season. We listened and have been working on addressing many of the issues that concern residents. You have probably noticed the radar signs along Cleveland to address the issue of speeding, and maybe you noticed the security cameras in several areas around town. We hope by addressing these issues we can continue to keep our town and residents safe. Also, we have heard the requests for additional internet options. You will start seeing trucks and employees of Pavlov Media in town. They will be mapping out the area and running fiber optic on village right of ways. This may affect your property, but we have been assured that they will restore as close to how it was when they started.

As the weather improves, you will be ready to get the golf carts out again. We really hope you will review the rules with your family and follow them. I will have Janet send out a copy of the ordinance to all registered owners to refresh your memory of the rules. The number one issue we have is people letting their underaged/non-licensed kids drive the carts on village streets whether alone or with you in the cart. I hope you will not allow this to happen with your cart. It is dangerous for the kids driving and others on the road. If you have not registered your cart, please call the office to have it inspected and get a permit. Also, the 4wheelers and side-by-sides are not permitted on village streets or properties. Keep all motorized vehicles and equipment off the hill.

Finally, the Board and the Hazen Park Committee is looking forward to the dedication of the upgraded park. I want to sincerely say THANK YOU to everyone who worked to make this project happen. It really means a lot to the community. We hope you all will attend the dedication and enjoy the park this summer.

IN OTHER VILLAGE HAPPENINGS

Summary of notes from the meeting minutes:

December – Updates were given for summer road work projects and notification of when bids for the next phase of the northeast drainage project would take place. Resolution 2022-R-4 was passed for preferred truck route through town. Mapping for radar signs discussed. Approval of funds for materials for mounts. Village truck taken in for extensive repairs. Christmas parade another huge success and great feedback regarding the tree. Meeting adjourned for annual dinner at the Tavern.

January – Ed Decker and Darrell Rice spoke to the Board for support against the nearby proposed wind towers. (Gov. Pritzker signed a bill the following week taking the control out of the County's hands; therefore, the Village has no control over any future building of wind towers.) Approval of funds for summer road work. Washington St. project tabled until March/April. Approval of hiring a Sunday custodian. Drainage issues on Cleveland and Adams discussed.

February – Minutes will be approved at the March board meeting to be held Wednesday, March 8, 2023 in the Eileen Painter Room of the R. E. Franks Meeting Center. The meeting will begin at 7:00 pm.

Slow Down

The Board of Trustees have listened to the concerns of residents and the radar signs are now in place on Cleveland. These signs will be moved around town as necessary. Data will be

compiled and shared with the County Sheriff's office and may be published in future newsletters. Be alert for the posted speed limit on village streets. Unless otherwise posted the speed limit on village streets is <u>30</u> <u>mph</u>. Use caution at intersections, come to a complete stop at stop signs and pay attention to your surroundings.

Golf Cart Registration & ATV Use



Golf cart registration is now every two years. If you currently have a registered golf cart, your registration is good until April 30, 2024. If you have not registered your golf cart, please contact the office for inspection and

registration. The fee will be pro-rated to \$25. The biennial permit fee is \$50. A new sticker will be issued at renewal.

**Any person who operates a golf cart must have a valid driver's license and insurance coverage.

**Golf carts can be driven on streets after dark, only with proper qualifying equipment (headlights; taillights; signals; slow moving emblem).

**Open alcohol and/or drinking and driving are illegal.

ATV's and other off-road vehicles are NOT allowed on Village streets or properties, this includes the hill and drainage pond area.

Recycling

Help keep the recycling center and surrounding area clean and neat. <u>Please do not leave anything outside</u> <u>of the recycling containers if they are full.</u> This creates a wet, soggy, unsightly mess and added expense to the Village. The recyclers will not clean up. All boxes should be broken down. Do not use this area for garbage.

Burning Regulations

Residents may burn leaves, sticks and other dry plant debris grown or generated on their property in a safe manner during daylight hours. Please be considerate of smoke direction and neighbors. Some residents have health issues that are adversely affected by smoke.

Materials prohibited from burning: tires and garbage, including bones, meat, animal skin, feathers, entrails, organs, non-edible animal parts, grease, food and food by-products, coffee grounds and other materials per Ordinance 2008-545.

The village burn area is off-limits to the public. Please do not dispose of yard waste or any other materials at the burn pile.

Be a Good Neighbor

The Village Board encourages everyone to be a good neighbor and to keep the village clean and safe. Many of the calls we receive are just common courtesy, but from time to time an ordinance is required for guidelines. One of the most common summer questions is "Do I need a permit to put up a fence"? The answer to that is, "yes". The permit can be found on the web site or by calling the village office. You can also find the most up-to-date zoning and subdivision ordinances on our website. You should be able to search these documents. Please call the office if you have any questions or need further information.

Other ways to be a good neighbor:

- Always pickup after your animals, particularly when they defecate on any property that does not belong to you. This includes, but not limited to streets, public parks, and the Franks Center property.
- By law, dogs must be on a leash when not on the owner's property.
- Put trash receptacles away after garbage pickup.
- Keep your property neat and orderly. Do not leave piles of debris for extended periods of time.
- Mow your lawn in a timely manner.
- Be conscientious of noise levels such as early morning mowing or after dark.
- Be courteous when burning lawn debris. There are many people with breathing issues. Smoke from burning leaves is detrimental to their health. Do not burn wet piles of leaves, sticks and other plants.

A little bit of Philo history from the archives.

June 1969

Mumma to Receive State Farmer Degree

John Mumma, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Mumma Jr., of Sidney, and a member of the Unity FFA Chapter, will receive the State Farmer Degree on June 12 at the State Convention in Urbana.

The State Farmer Degree is the highest degree awarded by the Illinois Association FFA. Only two percent of the State's 16,500 FFA members receive this award this year. Recipients are selected on the basis of their leadership and participation in FFA activities, school and community activities, and income and net worth resulting from their FFA programs.

John has been secretary of the Unity FFA Chapter for two years. He holds the degrees of Greenhand and Chapter Farmer and has been the Chapter winner in Corn Production, Soybean Production, Swine Production and Crop Production. Also, he was honored as the Unity FFA Chapter "Star Chapter Farmer" this year. John started his farming program four years ago by renting 30 acres of land from his father. He has grown corn and soybeans on the land. He also has had swine and sheep included in his farming program.

January 1966

Nathan Rice Gives Telescope to Philo Grade School

Philo Grade School is the recipient of a Dynascope telescope donated to the school by Mr. and Mrs. Nathan Rice. The telescope is equipped with an electric motor and 4-inch lens. This will make a fine addition to the Science Department and it is hoped that an astronomy club will be started in the near future. The Rices have also contributed several good books to the Philo Library for any interested young astronomers-tobe on astronomy.

April 1888

First Sidewalks

Large planks were used for the first sidewalks when Hale's Second Addition was plotted on April 16, 1888. The addition included all land East of Adams and South to Van Buren. The area was south of the railroad.

1864/1875

The Beginning

The Village of Philo was laid out by the son of Philo Hale, E.B. Hale in 1864 on 80 acres. In 1875 an election was held with a vote of 56 to 13 in favor of incorporating as a village. The charter is dated July 1875.

Muni Agg Energy Program

Did you opt in to the Muni Agg Energy program in 2021 that the Village of Philo participates in? There is still time as the current program expires in December 2023. The Village of Philo Board of Trustees negotiated through Good Energy in 2021 to give residents a choice in energy providers. Currently, Ameren tariff rates have risen substantially (12.8 cents per kWh), highlighting the savings that residents who opted in with the contracted company of Homefield Energy. (5 cents per kWH).
